Application for Inbound Ship Entering the International Port

Updated:2018/11/30

1. According to Article 59 of the Communicable Disease Control Act and Regulations Governing Quarantine at Ports, shipmasters of inbound ships arriving from foreign countries shall, within seventy two to four hours prior to entering the international port, report to the quarantine authorities the following for review:

- (1) Name of ship, call sign and voyage number;
- (2) The last port of departure, date and time;
- (3) Name(s) of port(s) anchored during the thirty days prior to arrival and the date of departure;
- (4) Expected date and time of arrival;
- (5) Types of sanitary control certificate for ship, and place and date of issuance;
- (6) Number of crew and passengers;
- (7) Any patients with communicable diseases or deaths on board within thirty days prior to arrival and their details;
- (8) Any animal deaths on board from unknown causes on board within thirty days prior to arrival;
- (9) Any breeding of rats or vectors;
- (10) Other relevant matters.

After notification, if death of person or patients of communicable diseases (including suspected), the person-in-charge shall immediately report the number of infections or deaths, names, symptoms or causes of death to the quarantine authority

2. Submit the completed Ship Quarantine Application Form to the quarantine authorities.

3. Ships, after entering the port, shall submit the following documents to the quarantine authorities to complete their entry procedures:

- (1) Maritime Declaration of Health;
- (2) Ports of call;
- (3) Ship Sanitation Control Certificate or Ship Sanitation Control Exemption Certificate;
- (4) Other documents deemed necessary by the quarantine authorities.
