

Nationwide epidemic alert to remain at Level 2

Level 2 Measures

- A mask should be worn at all times with exceptions listed in the annex.
- Contact information registration and social distancing.
- Crowd control or capacity limit management at commercial or public venues: at least 1.5 meters/person (2.25 square meters/person) indoors and 1 meter/person (1 square meter/person) outdoors.
- The limit on the number of people in gatherings (including **meetings, exhibitions, weddings and banquets**):
 - 80 people indoors or over 80 people indoors but a distance of at least 1.5 meters per person (2.25 square meters per person)
 - 300 people outdoors.
 - Any gathering that doesn't follow the aforementioned rules should submit an epidemic prevention and control plan or should be organized according to the rules of the competent authority.

Venues to remain closed:

- Singing and dance venues, nightclubs, clubs, hostess bars, bars, pubs, and beauty parlors (tourist parlors and audio-video parlors).

Venues that comply with the disease prevention and management regulations are allowed to open*

- **Video game arcades, Internet cafes, MTVs, KTV clubs (self-service KTV and telephone booth-like KTV), board game cafes, mahjong clubs.**
- **Religious venues or place of worship:**
 - Pilgrimage groups and dining events are conditionally allowed.
 - No requirement of checkerboard seating in religious venues or places of worship.
- **Dining:** No requirement of dividers or of a distance of 1.5 meters when eating in. Social interactions such as leaving one's own table to toast other tables are allowed at banquets. Rules for serving food to guests are eased in restaurants offering a set menu for groups and buffet.
- **Convenience store:** Hot food items including tea eggs and oden can be sold without the staff providing assistance.
- TV news anchors do not need to wear a mask while officially filming if social distancing can be maintained from other staff.
- * **Competent authorities: Ministry of Economic Affairs, Ministry of the Interior, Ministry of Health and Welfare, National Communications Commission.**
