In Taiwan, a total of 1,127 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 702 were acute and 425 were chronic; 7 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 10 outbreak events were reported. (1 Dengue fever, 1 Pertussis, 1 Unknown fever outbreak, 3 Influenza-like-illness, 2 Diarrhea and 2 Upper respiratory infections)

International epidemic: Dengue fever, Enterovirus, Acute Conjunctivitis, NDM-1, Rabies, Chikungunya, Yellow fever, Measles and Plague broke out last week in Philippines, Singapore, Malaysia, Sri Lanka, India, Germany, Lao PDR, Vietnam, China, Hong Kong, Japan, Indonesia, Russia, France, Senegal, Brazil, Romania and US. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, indigenous Dengue Fever cases in southern Taiwan continued to increase rapidly, Kaohsiung city and Tainan city were the most serious areas. Enterovirus epidemic continued to increase after school opens, not yet to slow down, and RODs consultation rates already approached the first peak of last semester. Moreover, the suspected melioidosis clusters occurred in Typhoon Fanapi affected areas. Since dengue fever and enterovirus epidemic continues to increase, and no signs of reversal, the forecast of Dengue fever cumulative case number this week, will more than 600 cases, and this epidemic already reached one of the conditions to set up the central command center. The epidemic alert of this week is upgraded to orange light signal.
