In Taiwan, a total of 1,040 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 602 were acute and 438 were chronic; 5 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 14 outbreak events were reported. (2 Shigellosis, 1 Dengue fever, 1 Malaria, 1 Melioidosis, 1 Scrub Typhus, 1 Diarrhea, 1 Upper respiratory infections and 6 Influenza-like-illness)

International epidemic: Dengue fever, Enterovirus, Acute Conjunctivitis, Pertussis, Cholera, West Nile Virus, Salmonella and Chikungunya broke out last week in Thailand, Vietnam, Hong Kong, Philippines, Malaysia, Singapore, Sri Lanka, China, Pakistan, Australia, US, Somalia, Cameroon, India, Greece and UK. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, indigenous Dengue Fever cases in southern Taiwan continued to increase, and three DHF/DSS cases occurred within one week, of which one died. In addition to prevent dengue vector mosquito breeding after Typhoon Fanapi, disaster related infectious diseases such as Melioidosis, Leptospirosis, and gastrointestinal diseases should not be overlooked; however, Enterovirus and Acute conjunctivitis epidemic slowed slightly. The whole disease epidemic is in highly alert condition. The domestic epidemic alert index of this week is temporary, kept to yellow warning light signal, and will closely assess the epidemic situation and adjust the alert signal.
