In Taiwan, a total of 1001 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 611 were acute and 390 were chronic; 15 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 9 outbreak events were reported. (1 Shigellosis, 1 Amoebiasis, 3 Varicella, 2 Diarrhea and 2 Upper respiratory infection)

International epidemic: Dengue fever, Enterovirus, Varicella, Rabies, Mumps, Cholera, EHEC Infection and Polio broke out last week in Philippines, Malaysia, Singapore, Sri Lanka, Brazil, India, Thailand, Vietnam, China, Hong Kong, Zimbabwe, Dominican Republic, USA, Haiti and Tajikistan. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, indigenous Dengue Fever epidemic in southern Taiwan decreased slightly, and 42<sup>th</sup> week was the current peak. RODs consultation rates for diarrhea continue to rise, and close to the warning level; RODs consultation rates for influenza no significant increased; Enterovirus and Acute conjunctivitis epidemic continued to decline. Since dengue fever epidemic is still at its peak and H5N1 human cases occurred in the neighboring countries this week. The epidemic alert of this week is keep to orange light signal.
