In Taiwan, a total of 1,004 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 569 were acute and 435 were chronic; 8 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 9 outbreak events were reported. (2 Dengue fever, 3 Influenza-like-illness, 2 Diarrhea, 1 Flu severe complication and 1 Leptospirosis)

International epidemic: Dengue fever, Enterovirus, Paratyphoid, Polio, Varicella, Cholera and Malaria broke out last week in Malaysia, Singapore, Sri Lanka, India, Pakistan, Thailand, Vietnam, China, Hong Kong, Uganda, Nigeria, Benin, Haiti and Venezuela. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, indigenous Dengue Fever cases in southern Taiwan continued to increase rapidly, Kaohsiung city and Tainan city were the most serious areas, there are also some clusters and sporadic cases in Taipei county of northern Taiwan. Acute conjunctivitis increased for two consecutive weeks; RODs consultation rates for influenza increased slightly; though Enterovirus epidemic decreased, still in the peak after school opens. Since dengue fever epidemic continues to increase, and no signs of reversal. The epidemic alert of this week is keep to orange light signal.
