In Taiwan, a total of 980 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 544 were acute and 436 were chronic; 29 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 2 outbreak events were reported. (1 Shigellosis and 1 Influenza-like-illness)

International epidemic: Dengue fever, Enterovirus, Varicella, Chikungunya, Cholera, Acute Flaccid Paralysis and Leptospirosis broke out last week in Cambodia, Malaysia, Singapore, Sri Lanka, Venezuela, Pakistan, Thailand, Lao PDR, China, Hong Kong, India, Zambia, Haiti, Congo and Nicaragua. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, indigenous Dengue Fever cases in southern Taiwan continued to increase, Kaohsiung city and Tainan city were the most serious areas. RODs consultation rates for influenza increased for two consecutive weeks; Enterovirus epidemic began to decrease and should have passed the peak. Acute conjunctivitis also showed a decline. Since dengue fever epidemic is still in serious condition. The epidemic alert of this week is keep to orange light signal.
