In Taiwan, a total of 1,461 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last 2 weeks, and among those 768 were acute and 693 were chronic; 10 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 9 outbreak events were reported (1 Dengue fever, 2 Shigellosis, 2 Chicken Pox, and 4 Diarrheas)

Last week, 3 indigenous dengue fever cases were newly confirmed, a total of 885 indigenous dengue cases were confirmed since epidemic season of last year, and 18.1% were geographically linked to Siaokang District and 32.2% in Cianjhen District, Kaohsiung City. As to the mosquito disease vector indices, none of City/County exceeds the critical threshold.

International epidemic: Rabies, Cholera, Salmonella Infection, Mumps, and Anthrax broke out last week in China, Indonesia, Philippines, Cambodia, United States and United Kingdom. Dengue Fever broke out in Colombia, Guatemala, Nicaragua, Brazil, Sudan, Thailand, Singapore, Malaysia and Southeast Asia countries. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data there was easing trend of the novel influenza A (H1N1) infections and indigenous dengue fever case during the Chinese New Year. WHO has declared new seasonal flu vaccine for northern hemisphere would contain Pandemic (H1N1) 2009 strain. The domestic epidemic alert index of this week is, therefore, shifted to orange warning light signal.
