In Taiwan, a total of 795 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 369 were acute and 426 were chronic; 8 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 5 outbreak events were reported. (Diarrheas)

Last week, the first case of enterovirus infection with severe complications has been confirmed, no indigenous dengue fever case was newly confirmed, a total of 885 indigenous dengue cases were confirmed since epidemic season of last year. As to the mosquito disease vector indices, none of City/County exceeds the critical threshold.

International epidemic: Rotavirus, Anthrax, Hepatitis A, Meningitis, Yellow Fever, Measles and Rabies broke out last week in Mexico, UK, France, Burkina Faso, Ghana, Togo, Chad, Cameroon, Philippines and Thailand. Dengue Fever broke out in Sri Lanka and Southeast Asia countries. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, the first case of enterovirus infection with severe complications has been confirmed, and case number of Chikungunya fever and Shigellosis were higher than the same period of past years. However, the pandemic H1N1 command center has been dismissed, and there was no indigenous dengue fever case for two weeks. The domestic epidemic alert index of this week is, therefore, shifted to yellow warning light signal.
