In Taiwan, a total of 1029 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 506 were acute and 523 were chronic; 12 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 24 outbreak events were reported. (1 Measles, 1 Amoebiasis, 1 Varicella, 1 Scrub typhus, 1 Acute Conjunctivitis, 1 Diarrhea, 11 Upper respiratory tract infection and 7 Influenza-like-illness)

International epidemic: Enterovirus, Community-associated Methicillin Resistant *Staphylococcus aureus* (CA-MRSA), Dengue fever, Rift valley fever, Cholera, Measles, E. coli infection and Polio broke out last week in China, Singapore, Hong Kong, Thailand, Venezuela, Panama, South Africa, Uganda, Malawi, United States and Tajik. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, upper respiratory tract infection outbreak events broke out; although Enterovirus physician consultation rates were increasing and one Enterovirus infection with severe complications was newly confirmed last week; however, no indigenous Dengue fever was confirmed last week. The domestic epidemic alert index of this week is, therefore, kept to yellow warning light signal.
