In Taiwan, a total of 1025 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 512 were acute and 513 were chronic; 8 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 14 outbreak events were reported. (1 Amoebiasis, 1 Dengue Fever, 1 Botulism poisoning, 1 influenza severe case, 1 Q fever, 3 Varicella, 4 Influenza-like-illness, and 2 Diarrhea)

International epidemic: Enterovirus, Dengue Fever, Measles, Rabies, Hantavirus infections, Malaria and Polio broke out last week in China, Hong Kong, Singapore, Malaysia, Sri Lanka, Thailand, Paraguay, Indonesia, Angola, Germany, India and Tajikistan. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, 2 indigenous confirmed Dengue Fever broke out last week; Larvae Index was over threshold in Kaohsiung City; Enterovirus physician consultation rates were increasing, but no confirmed Enterovirus with severe complications. The domestic epidemic alert index of this week is, therefore, kept to yellow warning light signal.
