In Taiwan, a total of 962 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 516 were acute and 446 were chronic; 11 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 9 outbreak events were reported. (2 Acute conjunctivitis, 2 Influenza-like-illness, 2 Upper respiratory infection, and 3 Diarrhea)

International epidemic: Enterovirus, Dengue fever, Measles, Pertussis, Yellow fever, Salmonella, Rotavirus and Cholera broke out last week in China, Singapore, Malaysia, Vietnam, Ecuador, Philippines, Japan, Cameroon, the United States, Guatemala, Uganda and Thailand. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, several Larvae Index data in Kaohsiung City were over threshold; Enterovirus physician consultation rate was still increasing and some acute conjunctivitis outbreaks in schools due to Enterovirus; but no confirmed indigenous Dengue fever and Enterovirus with severe complications broke out last week. The domestic epidemic alert index of this week is, therefore, kept to yellow warning light signal.
