In Taiwan, a total of 779 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 420 were acute and 359 were chronic; 17 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 8 outbreak events were reported. (1 Measles, 1 Amoebiasis, 2 Pertussis, 2 Upper respiratory infections and 2 Influenza-like-illness)

International epidemic: Enterovirus, Dengue Fever, Varicella, Cholera, Plague, and Salmonella infection broke out last week in China, Hong Kong, Singapore, Malaysia, Thailand, Cambodia, Philippines, Japan, France and the United States. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, indigenous Measles cases and Pertussis clusters were confirmed; death Influenza severe case and Enterovirus infection with severe complications were reported; Enterovirus physician consultation rates were increasing and on the peak of epidemic; several Larvae Index data were over threshold in Kao-Ping Area and Tainan city, but no new confirmed indigenous Dengue Fever cases. The domestic epidemic alert index of this week is, therefore, kept to yellow warning light signal.
