In Taiwan, a total of 958 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 519 were acute and 439 were chronic; 10 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 11 outbreak events were reported. (1 Dengue Fever, 1 Acute hepatitis A, 1 Pertussis, 1 Conjunctivitis, 1 Diarrhea, 2 Upper respiratory infections, 2 Varicella, 2 Influenza-like-illness)

International epidemic: Enterovirus, Dengue Fever, Legionnaires disease, Measles, Pertussis, Polio, Rabies and Japanese Encephalitis broke out last week in China, Hong Kong, Macau, Singapore, Paraguay, Costa Rica, Honduras, New Zealand, Malawi, Zimbabwe, South Africa, France, United States, Tajikistan, Thailand, and Vietnam. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, imported Dengue Fever clusters; Pertussis family clusters and confirmed cases of Enterovirus infection with severe complications were confirmed last week; Enterovirus physician consultation rates were increasing and on the peak of epidemic; though no new confirmed indigenous Dengue Fever cases; heavy rain for several days and many Larvae Index data were over threshold in Southern Taiwan. The domestic epidemic alert index of this week is, therefore, kept to yellow warning light signal.
