In Taiwan, a total of 916 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 437 were acute and 479 were chronic; 47 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 7 outbreak events were reported. (1 Amoebiasis, 1 severe complicated influenza case, 3 influenza-like-illness and 2 upper respiratory infections)

International epidemic: Enterovirus, Dengue Fever, Pertussis, Cholera, Typhoid, Rabies, Measles and Malaria broke out last week in China, Hong Kong, Singapore, Philippines, Vietnam, Sri Lanka, Myanmar, Costa Rica, Japan, Papua New Guinea, Cambodia, Indonesia, France and India. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, Enterovirus infection with severe complications, indigenous Dengue Fever, and Japanese Encephalitis cases were confirmed last week; Enterovirus physician consultation rates were increasing; Larvae Index data were over threshold in Kaohsiung City and Kaohsiung County, and Japanese Encephalitis cases were in the increasing trend recently, however, the whole disease epidemic is in controllable condition. The domestic epidemic alert index of this week is, therefore, kept to yellow warning light signal.
