In Taiwan, a total of 952 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 490 were acute and 462 were chronic; 11 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 10 outbreak events were reported. (1 Food poisoning, 1 Rubella, 1 Diarrhea, 5 influenza-like-illness and 2 Conjunctivitis)

International epidemic: Enterovirus, Dengue Fever, Pertussis, Mumps, Meningococcal Meningitis, Polio, Japanese encephalitis and Malaria broke out last week in China, Japan, Hong Kong, Singapore, Philippines, Thailand, Venezuela, Brazil, Colombia, Honduras, United States, Mexico, Tajikistan and India. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, a new Melioidosis death case was confirmed; Enterovirus infection with severe complications and Japanese Encephalitis cases were confirmed; however, Enterovirus and Conjunctivitis physician visiting rates were decreasing. The domestic epidemic alert index of this week is, therefore, kept to yellow warning light signal.
