In Taiwan, a total of 949 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 507 were acute and 442 were chronic; 11 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 8 outbreak events were reported. (1 Dengue Fever, 1 Severe complicated influenza, 1 Paratyphoid Fever, 1 Upper respiratory infection, 1 Enterovirus, 1 Influenza-like-illness and 2 Shigellosis)

International epidemic: Enterovirus, Dengue Fever, Japanese encephalitis, Polio, Malaria, Cholera, Yellow Fever and Norovirus broke out last week in China, South Korea, Hong Kong, Singapore, Thailand, Indonesia, Puerto Rico, Colombia, India, Philippines, Tajikistan, Kenya, Congo, Canada and United Kingdom. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, new H1N1 death cases were confirmed; indigenous dengue fever and Japanese encephalitis cases were confirmed; several imported clusters broke out; however, Enterovirus and Conjunctivitis physician visiting rates were decreasing and no Enterovirus infection with severe complications case was confirmed last week. The domestic epidemic alert index of this week is, therefore, kept to yellow warning light signal.
