In Taiwan, a total of 880 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 463 were acute and 417 were chronic; 12 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 10 outbreak events were reported. (1 Dengue Fever, 1 Amoebiasis, 1 Conjunctivitis, 5 Influenza-like-illness and 2 Upper respiratory infections)

International epidemic: Enterovirus, Dengue Fever, Polio, Salmonellosis, Chikungunya Fever, Measles and Cholera broke out last week in China, Hong Kong, Macau, Singapore, Thailand, Malaysia, Indonesia, Venezuela, Russia, Tajikistan, Reunion, Gabon, Zambia and Germany. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, cases of Botulinum Poisoning, Japanese Encephalitis, Enterovirus infection with severe complications, indigenous Dengue Fever clusters were confirmed last week; several Larvae Index data were over threshold in Kaohsiung City, Kaohsiung County and Tainan City; Enterovirus physician consultation rates were increasing and on the peak of epidemic. The domestic epidemic alert index of this week is, therefore, kept to yellow warning light signal.
