In Taiwan, a total of 930 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 464 were acute and 466 were chronic; 9 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 11 outbreak events were reported. (1 Dengue fever, 1 Amoebiasis, 1 Conjunctivitis, 1 Upper respiratory infection and 7 Influenza-like-illness)

International epidemic: Enterovirus, Dengue Fever, Malaria, Pertussis, Plague, Measles, Hantavirus infection, Polio and Cholera broke out last week in China, Hong Kong, Singapore, Thailand, Malaysia, USA, Zimbabwe, Peru, Canada, Greece, Germany, Tajikistan and Laos. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, influenza epidemics were slightly increasing, new H1N1 death cases and Japanese Encephalitis cases were confirmed last week, Larvae Index data were over threshold in southern Taiwan; however, no indigenous Dengue fever was confirmed and Enterovirus physician visiting rates were decreasing last week. The domestic epidemic alert index of this week is, therefore, kept to yellow warning light signal.
