In Taiwan, a total of 902 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 451 were acute and 451 were chronic; 13 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 18 outbreak events were reported. (4 Dengue Fever, 9 Influenza-like-illness, 4 Upper respiratory infections and 1 Diarrhea)

International epidemic: Japanese Encephalitis, Enterovirus, Dengue Fever, Mumps, Cholera, Pertussis and Rabies broke out last week in India, China, Hong Kong, Singapore, Latvia, Serbia, Philippines, Vietnam, Malaysia, Thailand, Sri Lanka, Israel, Cameroon, Nigeria, the United States and Peru. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, indigenous Dengue fever cases were confirmed in several cities/counties; several Influenza-like-illness outbreaks broke out last week; severe complicated influenza death cases and Japanese Encephalitis cases were confirmed; however, the whole disease epidemic is in controllable condition. The domestic epidemic alert index of this week is, therefore, kept to yellow warning light signal.
