In Taiwan, a total of 896 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 490 were acute and 406 were chronic; 11 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 13 outbreak events were reported. (3 Dengue fever, 2 Pertussis, 2 Upper respiratory infections and 6 Influenza-like-illness)

International epidemic: Dengue Fever, Japanese Encephalitis, Enterovirus, Enterohaemorrhagic E. coli Infection, Rabies, Leptospirosis, Melioidosis, Plague, Salmonella and Cholera broke out last week in Philippines, Malaysia, Thailand, Nepal, India, China, Hong Kong, Singapore, Japan, Indonesia, Bolivia, Peru and the United States. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, several new indigenous and imported Dengue fever cases were confirmed, also first dengue hemorrhagic fever death case was reported last week; severe complicated influenza death cases and Japanese Encephalitis cases were confirmed; however, the whole disease epidemic is in controllable condition. The domestic epidemic alert index of this week is, therefore, kept to yellow warning light signal.
