In Taiwan, a total of 875 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 436 were acute and 439 were chronic; 8 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 7 outbreak events were reported. (1 Severe complicated influenza, 1 Amoebiasis, 1 Conjunctivitis, 1 Upper respiratory infection, 1 Unknown Fever and 2 Influenza-like-illness)

International epidemic: Enterovirus, Dengue Fever, Mumps, EHEC infection, Malaria, Cholera, Equine encephalitis and Plague broke out last week in China, Vietnam, Hong Kong, Singapore, Philippines, Malaysia, Sri Lanka, Honduras, El Salvador, Japan, Israel, Netherlands, United Kingdom, Cameroon, Panama and Peru. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, new H1N1 death cases and Japanese Encephalitis cases were confirmed, Larvae Index data were over threshold in Kaohsiung City and Kaohsiung County; however, Enterovirus physician visiting rates were decreasing and no Enterovirus infection with severe complications case and indigenous Dengue Fever were confirmed last week. The domestic epidemic alert index of this week is, therefore, kept to yellow warning light signal.
