In Taiwan, a total of 988 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 577 were acute and 411 were chronic; 18 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 24 outbreak events were reported. (3 Dengue fever, 5 Acute conjunctivitis, 6 Influenza-like-illness, 5 Upper respiratory infections, 3 Diarrhea, 1 Unknown fever and 1 Shigellosis)

International epidemic: Dengue Fever, Enterovirus, Cholera, Polio, Rabies, Anthrax, Chickenpox, Measles, West Nile Virus and Ticks-bite infections broke out last week in Dominican Republic, India, Sri Lanka, Thailand, China, Hong Kong, Singapore, Nigeria, Angola, Democratic Republic of Congo, Russia, Afghanistan, Indonesia, Bangladesh, Romania and France. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, indigenous Dengue Fever cases in southern Taiwan rapid increase and spread to neighboring regions, also has appeared four kinds of virus type at the same time, patients suffering from dengue haemorrhagic fever threat of greatly increased; on the other hand, Enterovirus and Acute conjunctivitis increased after school opens; however, the whole disease epidemic is in controllable condition. The domestic epidemic alert index of this week is, therefore, kept to yellow warning light signal.
