In Taiwan, a total of 1045 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 610 were acute and 435 were chronic; 80 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 31 outbreak events were reported. (1 Dengue fever, 1 Pertussis, 17 Acute conjunctivitis, 7 Influenza-like-illness, 3 Upper respiratory infections and 2 Shigellosis)

International epidemic: Dengue fever, Enterovirus, West Nile Fever, Polio, Anthrax, Malaria, Acute Conjunctivitis and Measles broke out last week in Mexico, Thailand, Malaysia, Singapore, Philippines, China, Hong Kong, Hungary, Greece, Turkey, Russia, Turkmenistan, Bangladesh, India and Zambia. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, indigenous Dengue Fever cases in southern Taiwan rapid increase and spread to neighboring regions, also has appeared four kinds of virus type at the same time, patients suffering from dengue haemorrhagic fever threat of greatly increased; 2nd indigenous dengue hemorrhagic fever was confirmed; on the other hand, Enterovirus and Acute conjunctivitis increased after school opens; however, the whole disease epidemic is in controllable condition. The domestic epidemic alert index of this week is, therefore, kept to yellow warning light signal.
