In Taiwan, a total of 924 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 572 were acute and 352 were chronic; 15 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 20 outbreak events were reported. (2 Dengue fever, 1 Pertussis, 1 Diarrhea, 7 Acute conjunctivitis, 5 Upper respiratory infections and 4 Influenza-like-illness)

International epidemic: Dengue fever, Enterovirus, Acute Conjunctivitis, Salmonella, Malaria, Rabies, Legionellosis and Plague broke out last week in Colombia, Malaysia, Singapore, Hong Kong, Thailand, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Honduras, China, Mexico, UK, Democratic Republic of Congo, Vietnam, and New Zealand. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, indigenous Dengue Fever cases in southern Taiwan rapid increase and spread to five neighboring counties/cities, also has appeared four kinds of virus type at the same time, patients suffering from dengue haemorrhagic fever threat of greatly increased; Typhoon Fanapi caused severe damage in southern Taiwan, in addition to prevent dengue vector mosquito breeding, disaster related infectious diseases should not be overlooked. Also, Enterovirus and Acute conjunctivitis increased after school opens. The whole disease epidemic is in highly alert condition. The domestic epidemic alert index of this week is temporary, kept to yellow warning light signal, and will closely assess the epidemic situation and adjust the alert signal.
