In Taiwan, a total of 966 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 532 were acute and 434 were chronic; 13 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 15 outbreak events were reported. (3 Dengue fever, 6 Upper respiratory infections, 5 Influenza-like-illness and 1 Diarrhea)

International epidemic: Dengue Fever, Enterovirus, Salmonella, Measles, Cholera, Anthrax, Plague, West Nile Virus, Rift Valley Fever and Pertussis broke out last week in India, Thailand, Malaysia, Vietnam, Philippines, China, Hong Kong, Singapore, United States, Nigeria, Cameroon, Bangladesh, Mongolia, Greece, Russia, South Africa and Ireland. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, several new indigenous Dengue Fever cases were confirmed last week and gradually spread to neighboring regions, the accumulation of water in containers due to the heavy rain in southern Taiwan resulting in breeding source environment; however, the whole disease epidemic is in controllable condition. The domestic epidemic alert index of this week is, therefore, kept to yellow warning light signal.
