In Taiwan, a total of 933 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 579 were acute and 354 were chronic; 67 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 17 outbreak events were reported. (1 Shigellosis, 1 Scrub Typhus, 1 Varicella, 6 Diarrhea, 2 Upper respiratory infections and 6 Influenza-like infections)

International epidemic: Dengue Fever, Cholera, Legionellosis, Measles, Yellow Fever, Hantavirus, Mumps and Crimean-Congo Hemorrhagic Fever broke out last week in Philippines, Thailand, Venezuela, Papua New Guinea, Mozambique, Haiti, Dominican Republic, New Zealand, Australia, Uganda, Brazil, UK and India. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, indigenous Dengue Fever epidemic in southern Taiwan decreased obviously; consultation rates for diarrhea in ER and outpatient decreased slightly, clustering reports were also decreased; RODs consultation rates for influenza have reached the peak, it is estimated that consultation rates for influenza will reach 25% during Chinese New Year period. The epidemic alert of this week is keep to yellow light signal.
