In Taiwan, a total of 1,111 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 705 were acute and 406 were chronic; 20 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 13 outbreak events were reported. (2 Severe complicated influenza case, 1 Amoebiasis, 2 Varicella, 1 Upper respiratory infections, 2 Diarrhea, and 5 Influenza-like infections)

International epidemic: Dengue Fever, Varicella, Hand-Foot-Mouth Diseases, Measles, Yellow Fever, Cholera, Acute Flaccid Paralysis and Crimean-Congo Hemorrhagic Fever broke out last week in Philippines, Malaysia, China, New Zealand, Nigeria, Cote d'Ivoire, Venezuela, Haiti, Dominican Republic and India. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, indigenous Dengue Fever epidemic in southern Taiwan decreased obviously; consultation rates for diarrhea in ER and outpatient increased last week; RODs consultation rates for influenza have reached the peak last week, since outpatient clinics will suspend during Chinese New Year, consultation rates for influenza will continue to rise. The epidemic alert of this week is keep to yellow light signal.
