In Taiwan, a total of 1,964 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last 2 weeks, and among those 1,360 were acute and 604 were chronic; 51 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 16 outbreak events were reported. (2 Dengue fever, 2 Varicella, 2 Shigellosis, 2 Fever of unknown origins, 2 Influenza-like infections, 4 Upper respiratory infections, 1 Endemic typhus fever and 1 Diarrhea)

International epidemic: Ross River Virus, Measles, Acute Flaccid Paralysis, Yellow Fever, Dengue Fever, Cholera, Crimean-Congo Hemorrhagic Fever and Nipah Virus broke out last week in DR Congo, Australia, Singapore, Congo, Spain, Cote d'Ivoire, Bolivia, Peru, Haiti, Dominican Republic, Venezuela, India and Bangladesh. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, influenza epidemic has reached its peak on 4th week; it still remains in serious situation. There were sporadic indigenous dengue fever cases in southern Taiwan; consultation attendances for diarrhea in ER and outpatient still in the peak. Since schools will begin this week and infectious diseases spread easily on campus. The epidemic alert of this week is keep to yellow light signal.
