In Taiwan, a total of 1,087 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 739 were acute and 348 were chronic; 29 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 16 outbreak events were reported. (1 Pertussis, 1 Amoebiasis, 1 Varicella, 6 Diarrhea, 4 Influenza-like infections and 3 Upper respiratory infections)

International epidemic: Norovirus Infections, Typhoid Fever, Rabies, Rubella, Nipah Virus Infections, Cholera, Q Fever, Meningococcal Meningitis and Dengue Fever broke out last week in China, Philippines, Indonesia, Vietnam, Ukraine, Bangladesh, Ghana, Cote d'Ivoire, Venezuela, Haiti, Netherlands and Australia. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, influenza epidemic has reached its peak on 4th week; consultation rates for influenza in ER and outpatient gradually decreased. There were sporadic indigenous dengue fever cases in southern Taiwan; consultation attendances for diarrhea in ER and outpatient decreased gradually. The epidemic alert of this week is keep to yellow light signal.
