In Taiwan, a total of 938 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 521 were acute and 417 were chronic; 13 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 8 outbreak events were reported. (1 Shigellosis, 1 Diarrhea, 1 Typhoid fever, 1 Fever of unknown origins, 2 Upper respiratory infections and 2 Rubella)

International epidemic: Dengue Fever, Measles, Cholera, Yellow Fever, E. coli O111, Salmonella and Hand-Foot-Mouth Disease broke out last week in Philippines, Singapore, Malaysia, Bangladesh, Canada, Switzerland, UK, USA, Cameroon, Kenya, Japan, Ireland and China. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, enterovirus consultation rate continuously increased over the previous week and gradually into the epidemic season, should closely monitor the epidemic changes. Rubella imported cases significantly increased, and those imported cases already lead to local clustering events, should strengthen the prevention measures; measles confirmed cases continued to occur, should closely monitor the epidemic changes and strengthen to track the infection sources and prevention measures. The epidemic alert of this week is up to yellow light signal.
