In Taiwan, a total of 935 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 485 were acute and 450 were chronic; 13 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 8 outbreak events were reported. (2 Upper respiratory infections, 2 Diarrhea, 1 Fever of unknown origins, 1 Amoebiasis, 1 Pertussis and 1 Varicella)

International epidemic: Ebola, Dengue fever, Cholera, Rabies, Anthrax, Rubella, Diphtheria, Malaria and Unknown diseases broke out last week in Uganda, Hong Kong, Thailand, Vietnam, Philippines, UK, Dominica, India, Bangladesh, France, Ghana and Somalia. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, enterovirus consultation rate continuously increased and is expected into the epidemic season in late May; will closely monitors the epidemic changes. Measles confirmed cases continued to occur, should closely monitor the epidemic changes and strengthen to track the infection sources. IPD confirmed cases and confirmed death cases increased than the same period of past years, should pay close attention to the epidemic changes. The epidemic alert of this week is up to yellow light signal.
