In Taiwan, a total of 833 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 432 were acute and 401 were chronic; 12 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 4 outbreak events were reported. (2 Upper respiratory infections, 1 Diarrhea and 1 Rubella)

International epidemic: Measles, Cholera, Murine typhus, Listeriosis and EHEC broke out last week in France, Ukraine, Haiti, Dominican and USA. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, enterovirus consultation rate continuously increased and already exceeded warning threshold this week, Coxsackie A is still the main virus strain from community respiratory virus surveillance data; will closely monitor the epidemic changes. Dengue fever imported cases increased recently, Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to those epidemic areas should strengthen anti-mosquito measures, and search for medical advices as soon as possible if feel sick to avoid the spread of the disease. Rubella imported cases increased significantly this year, and already led to 2 local clusters, should prevent travelers, foreign workers, foreign spouses or foreign exchange students bring about local clusters. First indigenous Japanese encephalitis confirmed case occurs this year, continued close monitoring of the situation changes. The epidemic alert of this week is keep to yellow light signal.
