In Taiwan, a total of 908 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 464 were acute and 444 were chronic; 11 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 5 outbreak events were reported. (2 Varicella, 1 Upper respiratory infections, 1 Diarrhea and 1 Pertussis)

International epidemic: Japanese Encephalitis, Dengue fever, Lyme Disease, Crimean-Congo hemorrhagic fever, Tick Borne Encephalitis, Streptococcus suis broke out last week in Germany, Malaysia, Philippines, Singapore, Cambodia, Ukraine, Kazakhstan, Russian and Vietnam. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, enterovirus consultation rate continuously increased, but still relative low over the past years, will gradually into the epidemic season in the following two weeks; should closely monitor the epidemic changes. The current influenza activities have returned to baseline level, and the domestic influenza-like cases were mainly infected with adenovirus since the 12<sup>th</sup> week from community respiratory virus surveillance data, should pay attention to the epidemic changes. The epidemic alert of this week is up to yellow light signal.
