In Taiwan, a total of 933 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 492 were acute and 441 were chronic; 13 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 6 outbreak events were reported. (2 Fever of unknown origins, 1 Shigellosis, 1 Pertussis, 1 Measles and 1 Dengue Fever)

International epidemic: Measles, Unknown Pulmonary Fibrosis, Malaria, Rabies, Poliomyelitis and Cholera broke out last week in USA, Japan, South Korea, China, Vietnam, Chad, Zimbabwe and Cameroon. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, enterovirus consultation rate already exceeded warning threshold and into the epidemic season, Coxsackie A is still the main virus strain from community respiratory virus surveillance data; though the fifth EV71 virus was isolated last week, there is no confirmed case this year, will closely monitor the epidemic changes. Dengue fever imported cases increased recently, Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to those epidemic areas should strengthen anti-mosquito measures, and search for medical advices as soon as possible if feel sick to avoid the spread of the disease. The epidemic alert of this week is down to green light signal.
