In Taiwan, a total of 917 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 509 were acute and 408 were chronic; 9 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 3 outbreak events were reported (one was pertussis and two were diarrhea).

Last week, 103 more confirmed cases of indigenous dengue fever broke out, a total of 489 indigenous dengue cases were confirmed, and 22.7% were geographically linked to Siaokang District and 36.0% in Cianjhen District, Kaohsiung City. As to the mosquito disease vector indices, those of Kaohsiung City, Kaohsiung County, and Pingtung County are higher than others and all exceed the critical threshold.

International epidemic: Cholera, mumps broke out last week in Malaysia, USA and Canada. Dengue fever is epidemic in Republic of Cape Verde, Dominican and Southeast Asian countries. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, there were increasing trend of the novel influenza A (H1N1) infections and indigenous Dengue fever last week, the domestic epidemic alert index of this week is, therefore, kept at red warning light signal.
