In Taiwan, a total of 753 notifiable infectious disease cases were reported last week, and among those 451 were acute and 302 were chronic; 8 cases died. As for the clustering on disease outbreaks, 1 outbreak event was reported (diarrhea).

Last week, 59 more confirmed cases of indigenous dengue fever broke out, a total of 647 indigenous dengue cases were confirmed, and 20.9% were geographically linked to Siaokang District and 34.9% in Cianjhen District, Kaohsiung City. As to the mosquito disease vector indices, those of Kaohsiung City, Kaohsiung County, and Pingtung County are higher than others and all exceed the critical threshold.

International epidemic: yellow fever broke out last week in Central African Republic. Dengue fever is epidemic in Southeast Asian countries. Taiwan CDC reminds all travelers to these areas to take adequate precaution and preventive measures.

In conclusion, according to Taiwan CDC surveillance data, there were easing trend of the novel influenza A (H1N1) infections and severe situation of indigenous Dengue fever last week, the domestic epidemic alert index of this week is, therefore, kept at red warning light signal.
