The sum of suspected cases of notifiable infectious diseases reported in Taiwan last week reached 808, of which 446 cases were acute and 362 chronic. Aside from that, 22 cases died and 6 incidents of clustering infections broke out involving 21 individuals. These clusters included 2 incidents each of pertussis and chicken pox, and 1 each of fever of unknown cause(s) and upper respiratory duct infection.

As to the domestic H1N1 novel influenza endemic situation, we have spotted a total of 78 cases since April 26, 2009, the day we started the surveillance. Good thing about it is that all of them were mild cases, or none of them has become severe or fatal. Also starting from June 1, 2009 to the present, another novel influenza surveillance effort focusing on domestic community level showed a viral positive rate of 28.6% (8/28). The enterovirus endemic situation appears to be somewhere in the later stage of an epidemic, and it is likely to subside gradually from now on. Again, the Dengue fever individual cases are just about as uneventful as what happened one year back. Regarding the monitoring efforts of mosquito disease vector, the average Breteau index of the 5 counties/cities of Southern Taiwan in the 28th week last year was 6.36, and the current one is 4.05 with individual figures of Kaohsiung City and Kaohsiung County are both higher than the average. Finally about the Kaohsiung World Game epidemiology surveillance data, among the 11 regions of the World Game sites, other than “adult index” was found to be above the critical threshold in Fongshan City, and “Breteau index” also exceeded the critical threshold in Zuoying District, Lingya District, Sanmin District, Yancheng District, and Cianjhen District. They will be under continuous close monitoring.

According to all surveillance records and statistic data now available, the epidemic alert index of this week remains at yellow warning light signal.
